



2017 Intersession Offerings

Remember that Intersession groups may be capped to a certain number of students or require a minimum number of students to run, and cost estimates are just that—estimates. Final costs may vary depending on issues like transportation and lodging costs, material costs, etc. For more information about a particular Intersession, please talk to the sponsoring teacher(s).

First deposits and firm commitments on Intersession experiences are due from all students no later than Friday, September 9. Trips will fill up on a first-come, first-served basis. Deposits are non-refundable and will only be transferred if an Intersession trip has to be canceled. Consult with teachers for details on payment installments if they apply.

Hawaii- Art, culture, and ecology with Ms. Moore

Estimated cost: \$3,500 Maximum 12 students

First deposit: \$1,500 (due to Ms. Moore)

Explore Hawaii with Ms. Moore, learning more about the islands' unique culture, art, and history through exploration. Students will stay together in a rented house on the Big Island and experience the island's unique sandy beaches, bays, and lava flows together. Students will visit national parks and learn more about the area's marine life, taking advantage of the island's natural beauty and hospitality.

Boston – History and culture with Mr. Mota and Ms. LaGrange

Estimated cost: \$1,500

First Deposit: \$300 (due to Mr. Mota or Ms. LaGrange)

Students will fly from either Evansville or Louisville Monday morning to Boston, where they hope to stay at the Boston Hostel on Stuart Avenue near the Boston Commons. The group will take in sights like the New England Aquarium, Faneuil Hall Marketplace, the USS Constitution, Cambridge, MIT, Harvard Square, and many others.

Camping- Time in the great outdoors with Dr. Faulkner

Estimated cost: \$300* (This trip may be able to run for less cost depending on how far the group decides to travel to camp, and how they decide to get there.)

First deposit: \$100 (due to Dr. Faulkner)

Doc will work with interested students to come up with a camping plan that fits the budgets of those interested in going. Regardless, students on this trip will experience the great outdoors in this classic Intersession experience.



Sound Engineering- The ins and outs of music/media with Ms. Heck

Estimated cost: \$700 Minimum 8 students, Maximum 14

First deposit: \$300 (due to Ms. Heck)

Want to learn what it takes to become a performer, producer, or media executive? Join Ms. Heck to find out. This group hopes to explore all aspects of sound engineering, from recording to post-production, working with professionals in the know. The group plans a brief jaunt to Nashville to work with pros in an active music studio, where students will learn how to produce their own original music. They will also explore other careers in sound engineering and recording in the tri-state area.

Adulthood Part 2- Being a grownup with Ms. Sarol

Estimated cost: \$100

First deposit: \$50 (due to Ms. Sarol)

Back by students' requests, Adulthood Part 2 is a follow-up to an Intersession originally offered two years ago. This year, we will design the Intersession as a group based on students' interests. We plan to spend some time learning about personal security and self-defense, learn about financial independence and living/cooking/shopping on a budget, and give back to our community through community service. Note: portions of this Intersession may take place at Ms. Sarol's house, where there is a cat present. We may need to make accommodations for students with cat allergies.
