

# Intersession 2019 Offerings- March 18-22

## **SAN DIEGO**

**Trip Coordinators: Corrie Sarol and Ashely Swinford**

**Estimated cost: \$2,000-\$2,200**

**Deposit: \$500 paid to Ms. Sarol**

### **Overview:**

Students on this southern California adventure will help plan a trip catered to the group's interests and budget in partnership with the teacher leaders. Students will have opportunities to explore interests in marine biology/zoology as well as art and culture via activities like sea lion watching at La Jolla beach and research at local tidepools, as well as visits to museums in Balboa Park and the WorldBeat Cultural Center. We may do some hiking at Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve and spend some time soaking up San Diego's history in Old Town.

### **Logistics:**

We anticipate flying from Evansville on Sunday, March 17, so this trip will not be able to accommodate students who are unable to depart a day early.

## **TENNESSEE**

**Estimated Cost: \$800-\$900**

### **Overview:**

This intrepid group will drive to Gatlinburg, TN, where they will hike to a waterfall, visit the highest point in the eastern US, sit around a campfire, tell ghost stories and eat s'mores, learn about Native American culture, and get educated on the wild and crazy at Ripley's Believe It or Not Museum and Aquarium. A drive to Chattanooga will follow, where students will visit Ruby Falls, the tallest cave waterfall in the world, hike Lookout Mountain, take an inline railway ride to the top, and trek Rock City. Nashville, Country Music Capital of the World, will conclude the week. Students will tour Vanderbilt and Belmont University, visit the famous Honky Tonk Row in downtown Nashville, and maybe even take in a concert at the Grand Old Opry. Several other historically significant attractions may also join the itinerary, including Andrew Jackson's home and Nashville's famous Parthenon replica.

## **ANIMAL EXPERIENCES**

The group will also visit the Exotic Feline Rescue near Terre Haute and learn more about the group's efforts to protect big cats right here in the Midwest. In addition, the group may spend time at Turner Stables and give back a little at local animal rescues in town.
