

Ms. Phillips's Class

Supplies

- 6 Elmer Glue Sticks – purple tint
- 2 packs Crayola **Original** 10 count markers
- 2 packs Crayola **Original** 24 count crayons
- Scissors – child's pointed tip
- 2 big pink erasers
- 4 boxes of tissues
- 1 pack (**pre-sharpened**) Number 2 pencils
- 4 pk of thin colored highlighters
- 6 pk of thin Expo dry erase markers
- 3 two-pocket red folders with fasteners
- 2 - 1/2" Durable View Avery binder
- 2 packages paper napkins
- 2 boxes (25 ct) quart Ziploc bags

Additional Supplies

- Shoes:** For school, please purchase shoes that your child can manage **independently**. Most kindergarteners do not tie quickly or tightly enough to keep shoes tied well. For these reasons, we request that shoes have Velcro fasteners.
- Backpack** to carry folder and books home
- Spare change of season appropriate clothing** – store in the top of the locker
- Sharing bag** – a pillowcase or similar bag for transporting sharing items to and from school each week – keep in backpack or at home. Sharing will begin in September.
- Gym shoes** – to remain in the locker. Students will have PE every day.
- Art Class:**
 - Art Smock** or shirt to protect their clothes during art class. It should be heavy-weight enough that it is not easily soaked through, large enough to fit over heavy winter clothing, and easy for your child to get on and off. The Little Artist Paintshirt is recommended. Available online at <http://www.shop.thelittleartist.com/>. Likewise, an old, large denim shirt with the sleeves cuffed is also acceptable.
 - Art Journal** - Bound sketchbook, NOT glued tablet or spiral bound notebook type. Examples of acceptable ones are the Canson and Blick basic black bound sketchbooks, which can be purchased online at <http://www.dickblick.com/products/blick-hardbound-sketchbook/>.

Lockers: Primary school teachers ask that students **not** bring decorative items for the lockers; for example, gel clings, stickers, magnets, dry erase boards, photographs, hanging lamps, and rugs. While these things are fun for students, they create unnecessary distractions during the school day. Locker shelves will be permitted to help students separate and organize supplies, but any other novelty items will be sent home.
