Supplies

- 6 pack or higher glue sticks
- 3 boxes of tissues
- 1 package of 200 count paper plates
- 1 package of 200 count napkins
- 1 package of Post It notes
- 1 package of highlighters
- 1 package of Expo markers
- 1 box of number 2 pencils
- 1 box of 24 count crayons
- 1 box of colored pencils
- 1 box of thin markers
- 1 box of thick markers
- 2 big pink erasers (these typically come in a two pack)
- 4 three-pronged green folders
- Sketch Pad for second grade room (*This can be just a single subject notebook.*)

Additional Supplies

- Sturdy Art Journal:** Bound sketchbook, NOT glued tablet or spiral bound notebook type. Examples of good ones are the Canson and Blick basic black bound sketchbooks, which can be purchased online at <http://www.dickblick.com/products/blick-hardbound-sketchbook/>.

- 1 homework binder:** This should be a 5 1/2 by 8 1/2 1" binder (*you can reuse the one from first grade if you still have it*). You may choose any of the 7 color options. If kept in good shape, these will be reused in 3rd grade. (*you may also use the one from 1st grade if you still have it*)
